I am incredibly blessed at my age (almost 80) to be in good health, so my mountains (and maybe yours as well) might be chores needing done, repairs that need to be made, or the countless home improvement projects I seem to get myself into - wondering how in the world I'm going to do them. What I have found is that the moment I stand before my mountain, determined to conquer whatever it is, it immediately becomes more manageable and doable!

James 4:7-8a says: "Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Come near to God and he will come near to you…" When your mountain looms large before you, know this - it is Satan causing you to focus on the problem and the fears that go with it instead of the "mountain moving" power within you! By all means, ask God to remove the problem, but while you're waiting for Him to come to your rescue, confront it by coming near to Him with praise and worship, and watch the enemy flee, along with your fears and worries!
