"When Is Prayer Effective?"

I had one of my long winded epistles ready for this week, but wasn't satisfied with it, and didn't feel it was what the Lord wanted, so here's what I feel the Lord wants me to say. I'm really glad our Christian walk is a continual learning process, and I believe I've learned a little more about prayer this past month.
